Headmaster Report – Ross Worsham

- Westwood Giving Day is Dec.14th. K3-12 will be participating in community services projects throughout the day.
- Mrs. Vicki Davis and students attended conference in Dubai and are currently traveling back home.
- 7th and 8th graders will be traveling to Washington D.C. Dec. 6-8.
- Our student government has elected 2017/18 officers. It is the goal that the 2018/19 student government organization will hold campaigns and elections in which the student body will vote for officers.

Kicking off Annual Capital Campaign on December 14th

- Applied and received \$5,000 ADM grant for agriculture education project
- Applied and received \$25,000 from anonymous grant fund
- Submitted large grant application on Nov 1st
- GOAL as of 11/8/17 = 46 enrolled \$304,975; Board members and GOAL Committee committed to sign up for 100% participation

Academic Committee – Susan Glass:

- Met 11/6/17
- Feb 27th, 2018- Westwood will be offering the ACT here; the AC will provide breakfast that morning.
- MOWR: Students are signing up for the Spring semester
- Accomodations: Fran and Dicksy monitoring students; considering better utilization of lab services in middle/high, as HS students are not frequenting lab as they had in past years. Discussed 6th/7th grade study skills/organizational skills being taught (where is this concern to be addressed, lab vs. classroom).
- Teacher re-certification process has begun. Formal observations begin next week. RESA will be working with our teachers in the next few weeks incorporating technology and current plans.
