Legislative Update - LB Tucker

Tax Credit HB 217. Beginning with 2019, General Assembly approved tax credit aggregate cap will be substantially raised from \$58 million to \$100 million. Sunset of increase in 2029, but will have comprehensive economic review of program in 5 years. Reducing fees charged by SSO's and requiring reporting to DOR on average scholarship amounts awarded by federal poverty level quartile.

New Business

Current Language regarding Admissions Policy: Local transfer students are not accepted into the Senior Class. Non-local transfer students will be considered on an individual basis.
