## Headmaster Report - Keith Croft

- 403B Multiple Retirement Plan (403BMEP) - On January 24th, I had a Zoom meeting with Jake Connors of Compass Financial Partners regarding the Independent School Collaborative MEP Retirement Plan. This meeting was just an opportunity for me to listen and review this plan for a better understanding of employee benefits for possible future consideration.
- 100th Day of School - Update - This was celebrated on January 25th. We saw a lot of "old" students with gray hair and canes and a lot of big smiles. Thanks to Megan and PTO for supplying doughnuts and fun for all of our students!

- K3 Playdate and Open House - Jessica Adams and I will be meeting on Feb 20th to discuss plans for this event on Feb 25th @ 2:00. We will have our usual K3 playdate for new K3 families, as well as have tours and information for prospective families in attendance.
- Dr. Seuss Week - Our elementary students will be celebrating Dr. Seuss Week Feb 26 - March 1 with dress up days and other school activities.
- WW Discount Cards - These cards will go home with all students on Feb 20th and funds will be collected on March 1st. This is a voluntary fundraiser for WW. Special thanks to Amanda Heard for organizing this.
- March 10/11 GIAA/GISA Heads Meeting - I will be attending this meeting at Callaway Gardens.
- Windstream - I have been in numerous discussions (again) with Windstream
regarding the recent required price increases charged to our new account. After repeated efforts, I have hopefully conversed with someone who is working on getting this fixed and we will (hopefully) get the bill back to where it should be.
- Vaping issues - Due to the increased vaping crisis in the nation, I have been researching for relevant information (or a possible speaker) to update our MS/HS students. Most students do not know the harmful effects that vaping can have, and some may think it is safer than normal cigarettes. We would like to show them the true facts to hopefully deter this action.
- Busing possibilities - We are continuing to discuss and research ideas for possibly busing students from neighboring counties to Westwood. Notifications to gauge interest from parents have been sent out. We have personally contacted numerous people that have shown an interest from Moultrie and will be targeting the Cairo area as well. - Parent connections - In an effort to involve our younger families more in events/activities within our school, or increase our appreciation for them, the following activities are occurring:

2. K-3 teachers will be inviting parents/grandparents to be surprise readers each day during Dr. Seuss week. Our K-4 teachers are also going to be inviting parents/grandparents to read to students weekly as well in the future.
3. We are also looking at the possibilities for a spring activity or event or either an awards ceremony for our lower school.
4. Staff members at WW wrote 259 personal notes to every student at WW, expressing how excited they were to have them as students at WW. These were collected and mailed on Feb 15th. Our staff aggressively jumped on this idea and many expressed how much fun this activity was to them. I am sure that our students (and their families) will appreciate this gesture very much.

- EMC Honor - Congratulations to Sam Summerlin! Sam was the WW nominee for the EMC Washington Leadership Tour. Sam won over 9 students from our area and will go to Washington in June.

Athletic Update:

1. A pep rally was held on Feb 2nd and Senior Night was held at the basketball game vs Citizens Christian that evening. Senior players and cheerleaders were recognized that evening for their achievements.
2. Our boy's basketball team completed their regular season on Feb 16th, competing in
the AA region tournament at South Georgia College. The final rankings will be released Sunday, Feb 18th, determining what teams will advance to the State Tournament. The WW baseball, tennis, and track teams have been practicing for their upcoming seasons and will begin competing very soon.
3. Our parent led "Little Cats" basketball team, comprised of $2^{\text {nd }}-4$ th grade students have had a wonderful time competing this year. They have averaged 30 kids at practices, scrimmages and mini games played during halftime of our varsity games. We are excited about getting kids involved in sports early and this should help us to grow our program for the future.
4. A new edition to WW this year is junior pro baseball. Students in grades 3-4 and 5-6 will be competing this year. We are excited about this addition. Earlier this year, our junior pro softball and basketball teams practiced and competed very well. Again, involving kids in sports at WW at an early age will hopefully promote and maintain their interest in sports, which will ultimately enforce our athletic programs for the future. ## Curriculum/Guidance-Dicksy Hinesley

- All 9th and 10th graders have received their current HOPE GPAs. Transcripts are sent up to Georgia Student Finance twice a year, in January and June. Students have been encouraged to make and keep above a 3.0.

- I am getting ready for the Dual Enrollment parent and student meeting on February 29, 2024 , for $10^{\text {th }}$ graders \& any 11th graders who want to start DE.
- Elementary teachers have been encouraged to refer students to the lab for extra help.
- Ten transcripts, signed, dated and stamped, have been given to each senior to use for scholarships
- The Archbold Auxiliary Scholarship is back after a hiatus since the onset of

Covid. Scholarship opportunities are being posted on Bloomz and printed for
students.

- Ray Muggridge presented the STAR Student and STAR teacher winners to the MS \& HS student body on February 12.
- I have verified Georgia Student Finance Preliminary HOPE Scholarship Reports for seniors and underclassmen.
- We are examining a new reading series for the elementary school that has great reviews and that has been "strongly recommended" by the High Quality Instructional Materials Advisory List by the Georgia Language Arts Supervisors. I have ordered samples and have given teachers a guide for examining each grade level. Grades 3 \& 5 have come in. We are expecting the grades $1,2 \& 4$ to come in this week. We are looking for a series that supports our current Orton Gillingham phonics program.
- Sam Summerlin was Westwood's nomination for the competition for the EMC Washington Leadership Tour. Betsy Caldwell, AI Timmerman, Fran Sheffield and I prepped Sam with a mock interview where we supplied Sam with questions, made suggestions, and helped him get the nerves out! A thank you goes out to these teachers for giving up their planning period to help. I'm proud to say that Sam Summerlin won the competition and will go to Washington on an all-expense paid leadership trip this June. There were 9 nominations from the area for the competition. A special thanks goes to Mitchell EMC for this amazing opportunity for our community's young people!
- Around mid-March, many D1 schools will be releasing their admissions acceptances, so we are anxiously awaiting those.
- I've contacted Georgia Southern University's admissions counselor for our area about setting up a visit for early fall.
- We've sent home notices to parents about the digital PSAT 8/9 and the SAT being given on our campus in March. They were attached to all HS progress reports.
- I've been meeting with students whose grades have dropped.
- I've completed a survey through College Board concerning AP course offerings.
